Karen learned to knit and design simple sweater shapes from her aunt in the 1980s. Ever since then, you can pretty much guarantee she's got a sweater project (or three!) on the needles.

Fast-forward to the knitting boom of the early 2000s, when she could be found teaching at Churchmouse Yarns & Teas. For years, she also contributed to the prolific design team as they moved to publish their successful line of patterns.

Since retiring from Churchmouse in 2015, she's undertaken a rigorous course of study with Jean Wong in the Nihon Vogue school of Japanese garment design (which feels like another master's degree all over again, this time in knitting!). Like many of us, she's become more and more interested in sustainability and minimalism, which has translated into a personal mission to create the ultimate handmade wardrobe—with a stash that supports it. And since she also has many great friends in the yarn industry, she's thinking hard about how we can fulfill our creative desires, support the creatives who

make the great supplies we get to play with, all while staying grounded and sustainable. Tall order? She doesn't think so!

Part of the fun is figuring out just where my old, worn, tried-and-true equipment and traditions will take me. And I currently have several pounds of experimentally dyed rug yarn draped over my loom waiting for me to continue the creative process. Just how it will all fit together, I haven't quite figured out, but as design ideas come to me, I'll try them out. I suppose that is one of the secrets of experimenting. As so many others have said, some in our own Guild try it and see what happens. Use your experience, your past, your mother's old stash, and listen to what it tells you now.

It is your talent and creativity that makes our Guild work. So, ask yourself what you're going to learn this year, what you want to look forward to, and how you want to support our Guild.

*Financial Report:* Julie Packard – review of the 2018/2019 SJCTG Budget for clarification. Review of the 2020 SJCTG Proposed Budget. Motion to approve as presented: moved, Carol S., 2nd, Patty B. Motion passed unanimously.
